# The Poppy



Canadian doctor Lieutenant Colonel John McCrea was inspired to write the poem Flanders Fields and this inspired the use of the Poppy as a symbol of Remembrance

In Flanders Fields the poppies blow Between the crosses row on row, That mark the place, and in the sky The larks, still bravely singing, fly Scarce heard amid the guns below.

Facts you might not know about the Poppy:

- 1/ There is no 'correct' way to wear a poppy it's purely a matter of personal choice, simply wear it with pride
- 2/ The red colour is because it's the natural colour of the flower.
- 3/ The poppies we wear today are made in a factory in Aylesford, Kent.
- 4/ Over 40 million paper poppies are made each year, 10,000 wreaths and a million poppy pins.
- 5/ The money raised from the Poppy Appeal helps Armed Forces families who are struggling with physical and mental health, financial and practical hardships.

This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> Poppy Appeal organised by The Royal British Legion
